

Emergency Situations

When should I bring my pet to an emergency clinic?

- Foreign body ingestion (balls, sticks, cloths, strings, etc) with significant gagging and breathing problems
- Pale, blue, or white gums and mucus membranes
- Sudden back leg paralysis (common in Dachshunds, French bulldogs and Senior big dogs)
- Open mouth breathing with breathing difficulty in cats
- 48hrs-72hrs of inappetence in cats
- Consistent bleeding or hemorrhage from any body orifice
- Foxtail trapped in your pet's nose, mouth, ears
